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William H. Weaver Memorial Scholarship

Memo of Understanding & Criteria

I. Historical Narrative —

The William H. Weaver Memorial Scholarship was created after the untimely death of William Halsey Weaver, a 1963 graduate of the University of New Hampshire.

Mr. Weaver graduated with a B.S. degree in Civil Engineering and went on to graduate with a Master's degree in Sanitary Engineering from Harvard University in 1964. He was a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Construction Battalion and an associate member of the American Society of Civil Engineers. At the time of his death on July 14, 1967, he was vice president of the Weaver Brothers Construction Company of Concord, NH.

Monies contributed in his memory by his friends and colleagues in the New Hampshire Good Roads Association, make up the William H. Weaver Memorial Scholarship Fund. This fund is administered by a Board of Trustees, on behalf of the New Hampshire Good Roads Association, whose responsibility it is to see that monies are given to assist students in the College of Engineering & Physical Sciences, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering at the University of New Hampshire with an interest in transportation related studies.

II. Scholarship Applications —

Application for the scholarship funds must be made to the University of New Hampshire, College of Engineering & Physical Sciences, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering and include the following:

1. A statement of the student's professional interest:

What stimulated your professional interest in the field of engineering and all of its transportation related fields? Have you had any interesting employment or internships that have affected or reinforced your decision to become a civil engineer?

- 2. A statement of the student's reason for desiring the award and a statement of financial need: Explain your financial need for this scholarship and other reasons you desire this award?
- 3. Preference will be given to New Hampshire students and those who intend to work in New Hampshire upon graduation:

Please indicate where you see yourself geographically and professionally two to five years after you graduate.

II. Scholarship Applications – continued

4. Submission of transcripts:

Transcripts must be presented as part of this application. A minimum 2.5 GPA is required. In addition, please indicate how you would rate your academic performance and what courses you like/dislike?

5. Letter of Recommendation

A letter of recommendation will be submitted as part of this application.

III. Awarding of the Scholarship

The Trustees of the William H. Weaver Memorial Scholarship will meet no less than annually in conjunction with a designee of the College of Engineering & Physical Sciences, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering to determine the award(s) to be given for the ensuing academic year.

Candidate(s) will be notified by the College of Engineering & Physical Sciences, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering. The College of Engineering & Physical Sciences, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering will also be responsible for informing the University of New Hampshire Scholarship Office. The University of New Hampshire Scholarship Office will make appropriate arrangements for the applicant(s) to receive the proper credits to their account.

Completed applications should be submitted to the Dean's office by the second Friday of March; awards will be granted in April.
